NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

INCORPORATION AND MISSION

The Society is incorporated under the Society Act of British Columbia. Its mission is to provide education, prevention and support to those living with or affected by hepatitis C. The Society is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act effective December 5, 2001.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Society uses the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions and deferred revenue are recognized as revenues in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Membership fees are recognized as revenue in the year in which they are received.

The Society receives its operating funds from fund-raising, government grants and from individual and corporate donations. Although there is no absolute certainty of the continuation of this funding, the Board of Directors believes the Society can continue to meet its cash flow requirements for the 2021 fiscal year.

The unrestricted operating fund accounts for the Society's surplus from fundraising, bequests, grants and program operations.

Obsolete computer equipment has been removed from the financial statements.

The previous year figures have been adjusted to recognize the deferred portion of Gaming Funds received during the year.

GAMING FUNDS

The Society receives Gaming Funds from the Province of British Columbia which are restricted and for which revenue is recognized in the year in which related expenses are incurred.

These notes form an integral part of the financial statements.
